**ORDINANCE 548**

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE ALL PUBLIC PARKS AND FACILITIES TO PROTECT THE HEATH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF OUR RESIDENTS AND VISITORS**

**WHEREAS**, due to the current South Carolina State of Emergency, concerns regarding COVID-19, and the impact it is having in the United States and global communities; and

**WHEREAS**, South Carolina Code of Laws Title 5-7-250 subsection (d) allows for City Council to enact an emergency ordinance effective immediately to meet public emergencies affecting life, health, safety or the property of the people; and

**WHEREAS**, given the potential devastation this pandemic can cause on our community along with the priority the City of Tega Cay places on the health, safety and welfare of our residents and visitors; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City's parks and facilities are a great attraction to residents and visitors alike; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the City of Tega Cay has decided to take precautionary measures to prevent the continued spread of this virus.


